MESH – Mapping Music in Education, Social Care, and Health in the UK: West Midlands Pilot Project

The M•E•S•H (Music in Education, Social Care and Health) Survey is aiming to map supply and demand in the complex and diverse field of services that use music to deliver educational, social and health outcomes across the UK.

There are many organisations that provide active participatory music activities and interventions in these sectors. Some are specialist, such as Live Music Now, Drake Music and Music of Life. Others are part of music performance organisations, venues, festivals and conservatoires. However, across the UK, provision is ad hoc and lacks coherence. It appears that some people are in receipt of excellent music provision from one provider or more, while many others get nothing at all. For example, Live Music Now, one of the largest providers of tailored music interactions in care settings, works in around 250 care homes each year – yet there are over 20,000 care homes in the UK.

We believe that all organisations working in the sector should work together to improve what exists. As a first step, a scoping survey needs to be undertaken, and Live Music Now is working in partnership with **Music of Life** and **Sounds of Intent Charity** to commission research on both the provision of services and the potential demand from education, social care and health settings.

The research will be supervised by Professor Adam Ockelford, Professor of Music in the School of Education at the University of Roehampton, and Professor Graham Welch, Chair of Music Education at the UCL Institute of Education. Both are leading international researchers in the field. The project will be led by Live Music Now on a day-to-day basis on behalf of the commissioning organisation and Advisory Group.

As a first step, we are commissioning a pilot study with a focus on the West Midlands. It is anticipated that the research will cover, but not be limited to organisations that are delivering participatory music sessions, either in the community or in settings such as schools and residential care homes, or that bring participants into a venue for active participation.

The expected timeline is as follows:

- Recruitment February & March 2023
- Initial scoping exercise; March & April 2023
- Survey design and dissemination April & May 2023
- Analysis June & July 2023
- Report writing (first draft) August 2023
- Final draft, in consultation with Advisory Group September 2023
- Publication/Press launch September 2023 on

Specialist Music Research

- To create an electronic survey for organisations working in the field of participatory music activities
- To identify organisations working in the field of participatory music making in the West Midlands, and to create a database
- Working with regional and local stakeholders, to promote the survey to relevant organisations in the West Midlands to ensure their buy in
- To prepare a qualitative report to describe the main findings of the analysis
- Prepare findings for dissemination via published journals and public conferences
- Offer recommendations and learning for the national rollout of the survey
