Ways to use your residency

- Offer individual or small group sessions, always with at least one member of school staff present.
- Enrich the curriculum of children who may struggle to access the more conventional school sessions, due to their significant barriers to learning.
- Enjoy larger group 'concerts' and unique live music experiences – sure to prompt the most wonderful responses!
- Support and complement the School's curriculum and approach by having a designated member of school staff to liaise with the musician.





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Positives for Pupils

- A skilled musician brings a range of additional and exciting experiences for pupils, prompting extraordinary and unexpected responses from them.
- Having time and space to respond to sound builds all areas of pupils' engagement exploration, realisation, anticipation, persistence and initiation in the most enjoyable way.
- A personalised approach to developing the earliest stages of communication, and social skills, through individual or small group sessions with the musician.
- Opportunity to give new and sustained responses to music and sound in motivational sessions which are developed with the pupils each school residency is unique.

Positives for Staff

- Informal training during the sessions supports staff to build reactive, proactive and interactive responses to sound, and then add this to their existing 'toolkit'.
- Opportunity to observe and record pupils' responses during sessions and use this to support pupils' engagement in the wider curriculum.
- Joining the sessions allows staff to revisit and create similar experience in their own sessions, supporting pupil progress over time and meaning that learning during the residency is not lost, but absorbed in to pupils' overall school experience.

Positives for School Leaders

- Very effective use of Pupil Premium to address pupils' Engagement, Communication and Social Skills, alongside staff development.
- Residencies support high quality teaching by developing staff skills, knowledge and expertise. They can be used as targeted support for pupils' very early communication and social skills, and their early emotional development. For example, during sessions pupils learn to look, listen, wait, turn take, copy, lead, follow, respond etc.
- School leaders can have confidence that this 'intervention' truly enriches the school experience for pupils and has the potential to add to staff's existing understanding and expertise.
- An inclusive addition to the school curriculum, being fully accessible for all pupils and particularly suited to those with complex needs, who may struggle to access some aspects of school life.
